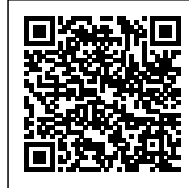




DIALOGOS: DR. WIDDOWSON ON EXPOSING THE ABORIGINAL INDUSTRY

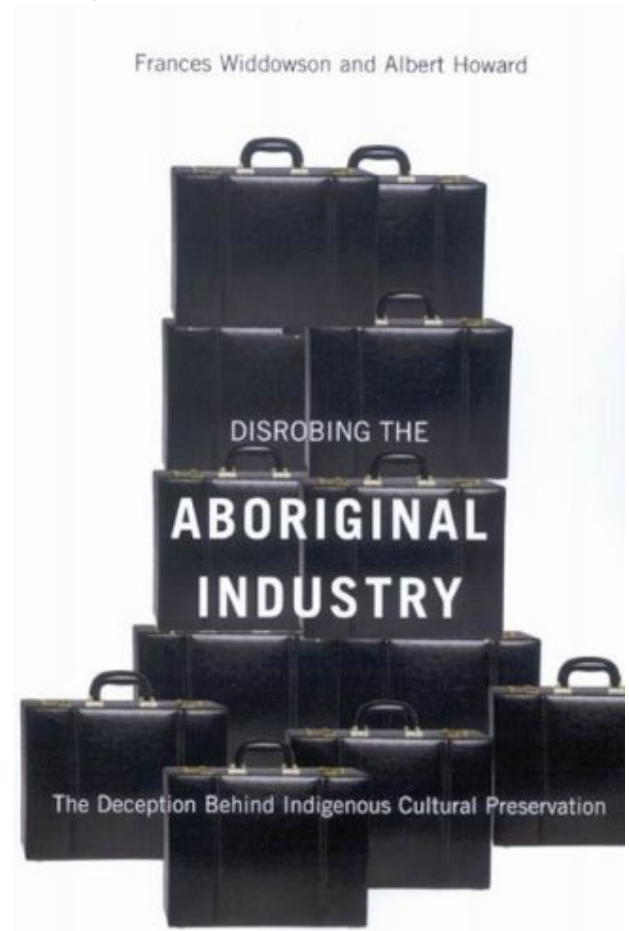
